Numeracy

2020 Vision – Practice intentional teaching and learning in the areas of mental math, computation strategies, and overall conceptual understanding.



Where we are currently with NUMERACY:

- All teachers documented growth with the Mathematical Concepts and Skills Inventory (MCSI) and used as a tool for planning and teaching. The pandemic helped us let go of where students "should be at" and truly support them where they are at.
- Many teachers created individual numeracy bags for students for school (and even-

tually home) so they can safely and practically continue to use manipulatives and play math games.

Teachers began communicating their teaching and student learning through the online program, SeeSaw. Communication aimed to be inviting and accessible, and tried to invoke conversation between child, parent, and teacher.

Successful co-teaching, the probability fair, and more rich tasks had significant impact on student understanding and engagement.



Well-Being

2020 Vision – Continue the daily practice and mindset of well-being for our school community.

Where we are currently with WELL-BEING:

- With all Physical Education classes moved outdoors, we practiced active lifestyles and outdoor learning.
- All staff were included in Professional Learning Communities to participate in a book

study of Kristin Souers' Fostering Resilient Learners. This study of trauma



and resiliency had a direct impact on classroom climate and staff mindset.

Regular updates in newsletters, social media, and in TE-PAC meetings kept the community informed of the importance of well-being. Our parent council ensured our staff and students felt seen, heard, and appreciated for their efforts this year.
