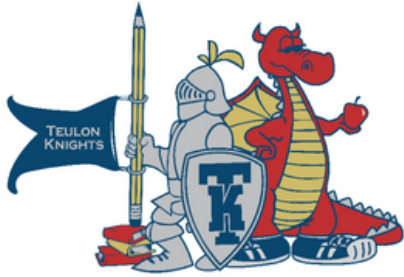


TEULON ELEMENTARY COMMUNITY REPORT 2021- 2022

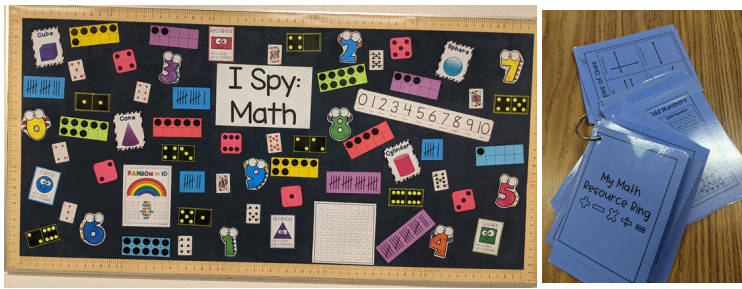

Our Areas of Focus:

Literacy, Numeracy and Well-Being

Literacy

- Our school's Early Literacy Teacher worked in all grade 1/2 classrooms to provide 30 minutes of daily extra literacy support.
- New guided reading and home reading books were purchased to add to our literacy resources.
- Grade 1/2 teachers worked with our divisional Literacy Support Teacher in their classrooms.

Numeracy

- A Monthly Math Memo was sent home to provide families information about what each grade was focusing on. It included games and activities.
- We used an online program called DreamBox for grade 4-6 students to enhance numeracy skills.
- New math manipulatives were purchased for use in all K-6 classrooms.
- Three teachers had math residencies with our divisional Numeracy Support Teacher.

Well-Being

- The walking trail behind our school and Green Acres Park were utilized for outdoor learning.
- Students were able to go on class field trips!
- Grade 5 and 6 students participated in the divisional track and field meet.
- Our disc-golf course is ready, the community is encouraged to give it a try!
