EASY APPLE CRISP

5 CUPS OF APPLES
½ CUP SUGAR
PASH OF CINNAMON
1½ TEASPOONS OF FLOUR

FOR TOPPING:

½ CUP OF BROWN SUGAR

½ CUP OF FLOUR

½ CUP QUICK COOK OATS

DASH OF NUTMEG

¼ CUP OF MELTED BUTTER



PREHEAT OVEN TO 350 DEGREES.

PEEL AND CORE APPLES, THEN SLICE THINLY.

PUT THE APPLES IN A LARGE BOWL AND ADD ½ CUP WHITE SUGAR, ½

TEASPOON OF CINNAMON AND 1½ TEASPOONS OF FLOUR. COAT ALL

THE APPLES EVENLY.

POUR THE COATED APPLES INTO A PIE PAN.

TO MAKE THE TOPPING, COMBINE BROWN SUGAR, FLOUR, OATS, AND NUTMEG IN A BOWL. ADD THE MELTED BUTTER AND MIX UNTIL CRUMBS ARE FORMED.

GENEROUSLY SPRINKLE THE CRUMBS OVER THE APPLES.

BAKE AT 350 DEGREES FOR 50 MINUTES.

SERVE WITH VANILLA ICE CREAM.
