#### An update from a few of our classrooms...

**Kindergarten** kicked off the month of February with some Groundhog Day festivities! Students made predictions on whether Manitoba Merv would see his shadow and graphed the varying responses. Students learned about shadows and how sunlight plays an important role: especially on Groundhog Day.

Kindergarten students have been engaged in their Literacy Time with Ms. Trombo and have enjoyed learning to play games called *Hot Seat* and *Kaboom*. Lots of great learning is happening in our classroom daily!





In **Ms. Hnatiuk's class**, we have been doing hands-on math while learning about arrays and multiplication. We use different manipulatives (seashells, buttons, blocks, etc.) to further our understanding of multiplication. In ELA we are reading Because of Winn Dixie and working through the UFLI lessons. In Science, we are studying and building structures using a variety of materials. In Social Studies, the students are working on a research project about a country of their choosing and this winter a small group presented a song and dance called The Continent Song! 

## a Word about Report Cards

It does not go unnoticed that report card time may come with anxiety for students and parents. When going over the report card with your child, set aside enough time to have a quiet, relaxed discussion. Keep in mind this is a snap-shot of where your child is right now and there is always room to grow. The comment sections are where the real communication happens, so read this area carefully. Following that, you can always reach out to your child's teachers to seek further advice via the agenda, email, or over the phone.

#### How can I help my child with their "next steps"?

We often over think this as parents. Helping your child succeed at school can be as simple as reading to them daily (the same books over and over is a good thing), involving them in every-day numeracy tasks such as grocery shopping, time management, baking, or having them write family stories, lists, and cards to loved-ones. Play cards and board games and make art together. Most of all, never underestimate the power of a family routine, sleep, and plenty of time outdoors.
