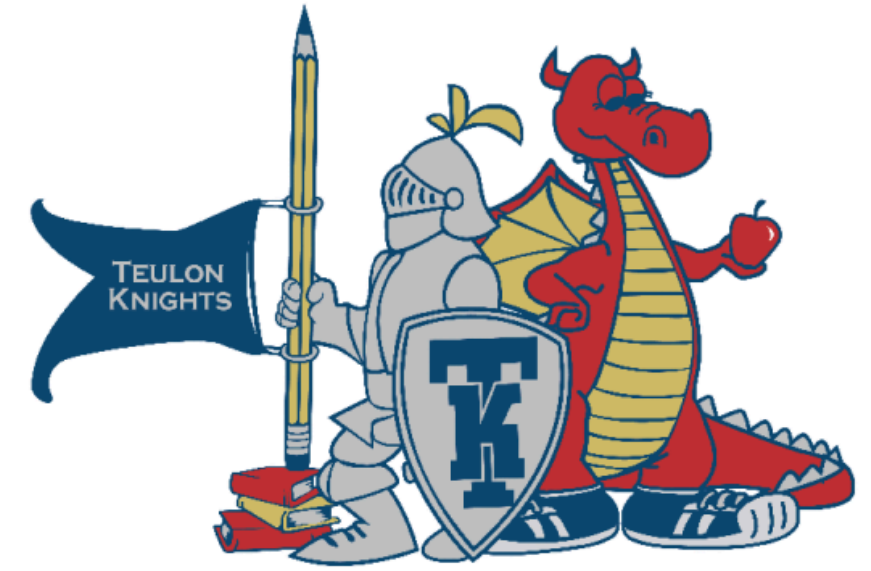

Our Beliefs

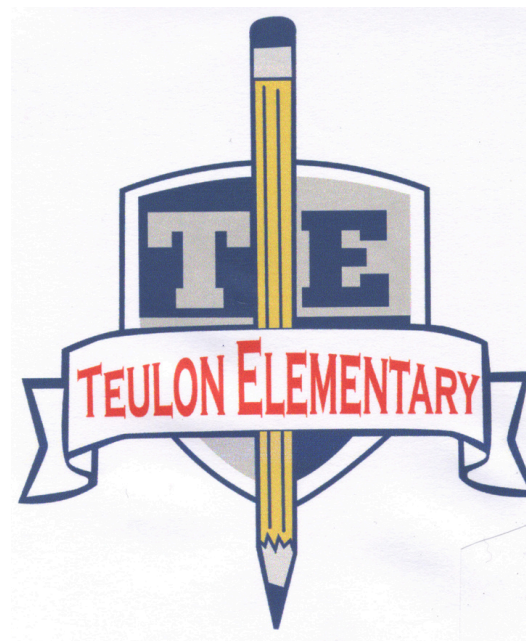

School Goals



Goal 1: Enhancing School Support Systems and Belonging

Our first priority this year was to cultivate an inclusive school culture rooted in mutual respect, shared values, and strong relationships across generations.

To foster community spirit and inclusivity, our school successfully facilitated monthly "Crews." Students participated regularly in team-building activities designed to strengthen peer connections and cultivate leadership. Progress was tracked using school surveys to ensure a positive impact on overall school spirit.

We opened our classrooms to the wider community through initiatives like our Grand-friend Days. Classroom teachers and students hosted relatives and community members for discussions and activities. To mark holidays and major school events, we coordinated whole-school and grade-based lunches, bringing everyone together to share a meal and celebrate our school community.

Goal 2: Indigenous Education and Outdoor Spaces

Guided by Manitoba's Mamàhtawisiwin education policy framework, our school committed to designing an environment that reflects Indigenous cultures and enhances community connection through land-based learning.

We have started the process of designing an Indigenous-inspired outdoor seating area. The space will be intentionally structured to incorporate Indigenous plants, promote gathering, and serve as an accessible outdoor classroom. Because this project is still in development, it will remain on our school plan for next year, when we look forward to collaborating closely with a Knowledge Keeper and our Parent Advisory Council to bring this vision to life.

Goal 3: Academic Achievement Through Effective Co-Teaching

To address diverse learning needs and elevate student achievement in foundational math and literacy skills, our school implemented targeted, data-driven instructional strategies this year.

Throughout the school year, every Grade 1 to 6 classroom benefited from at least one 50-minute block per cycle dedicated to intentional co-teaching. Classroom Teachers, and Learning Support Teachers collaborated to deliver differentiated lessons and targeted student groupings, providing enrichment for advanced learners while scaffolding support for those needing extra help.

Our Grade 5 and 6 math teachers combined their classes for a collaborative math block. Utilizing data from the Numeracy Achievement Program (NAP) and divisional pacing guides, teachers strategically grouped students across both grades to focus on key concepts. This targeted approach allowed for effective reteaching, mastery of essential skills, and peer collaboration.
